New Turner Block (TAC-11)

George Redman operated a tavern, the Golden Horse, on this site in the 1840s, 1850s, and 1860s. The current building is known as the New Turner Block for Lettie Redman Turner. This two-story common bond brick building was completed in January 1911. It has brick corbelling and decorative brick lintels over triple widows on the second floor. A department store, Taylor, Pruitt & Jarvis, first occupied the building. Number 103 was occupied by Lyon-Beard, a Chevrolet dealer, in 1927. Gasoline pumps were located in front of the building on Main Street at that time. The Columbia Avenue entry was used to move cars into the showroom. Later it housed Louie the Greek's Restaurant called the White Spot popular with teens, a furniture and dry cleaning business known as Service Cleaners. Ed and George Monson occupied the building in the 1920s. McKnight's Pharmacy, Margaret Ann's, and Nunery Law Office followed. The second floor housed several offices in 1911, Dr. C.C. Patteson, dentist; J.W. Kerr, Insurance; W.M. Jackson, attorney; Dr. M.E. Jones, veterinarian. During the depression, the WPA financed a night time recreational program for young people and they occupied the upstairs over the White Spot. Events such as supervised boxing matches took place there.
