New Turner Block (TAC-12)

George Redman operated a tavern, the Golden Horse, on this site in the 1840s, 1850s, and 1860s. The current building is known as the New Turner Block for Lettie Redman Turner. This two-story common bond brick building was completed in January 1911. It has brick corbelling and decorative brick lintels over triple widows on the second floor. A department store, Taylor, Pruitt & Jarvis, first occupied the building.

The building at 109 East Main Street was constructed circa 1911. Buchanan-Lyon occupied the building from the 1910s to the 1930s and sold hardware, buggies, and wagons. The first Ford agency in Campbellsville was located here. Lerman's occupied the space from the 1930s to the late 1980s. The first floor has a recessed entry. Additions to the façade include opaque glass and black tile. The recessed entry floor is covered with red tile. A leaded glass transom is situated over the east door. A pressed tin ceiling is found in the interior.
