Coakley & Durham Dry Goods (TAC-15)

This two-story Italianate style, common bond brick building was constructed in 1885. Simulated leaded glass transoms span above the storefront windows. A cistern remains in the courtyard in its center. Previously this building was occupied by Coakley and Durham Dry Goods about 1888 to the early 1900s. Caulk Appliance and Caulk Hardware were occupants beginning circa 1940.

Snappy Tomato Pizza occupied the left side at 117 on the first floor. Monson's first store was here in 1929. George Monson bought out Coakley and Durham.
