## Caulk Hardware (TAC-16)

This two-story Italianate style, common bond brick building was constructed in 1885. Simulated leaded glass transoms span above the storefront windows. A cistern remains in the courtyard in its center. Previously this building was occupied by Coakley and Durham Dry Goods about 1888 to the early 1900s. Caulk Appliance and Caulk Hardware were occupants beginning circa 1940.

Creed Haskins, the original owner, was written in the sidewalk in front of this store at 119 East Main Street. According to the Sanborn Fire Insurance maps, the building has housed hardware since its beginning. The only exception is noted on the 1908 map, which indicates the building was a bowling alley. In recent years, the Tulip Tree store occupied the east side at 119 East Main Street. Among the hardware stores in the early 20th century was the Smith and Flora Hardware. Caulk Hardware was its long-time occupant in the latter 20th century. Currently, the building is vacant.
