Davis Bros. Dry Goods; Phillips Bros.; Merle Norman (TAC-19)

Situated on the corner of South Court and East Main Street is the Merle Norman store. Constructed between 1876 and 1883, this two-story glazed brown with light tan brick building has stone lintels and sills framing the windows. The corbelled brick parapet wall accents the exterior.

Originally built to house Phillip, Putnam and Company, a general store or dry goods store occupied the building between 1886 until 1915. During those years, Ed Coakley ran a store, as did James G. Phillips, and J. R. "Hawk" Davis, operating with his brother, J.E. "Trapper" Davis, under the name Davis Brothers.

Clyde Williams Law Office was upstairs as was Johnny Burkholder's Insurance Agency in the front corner. In recent years, the building has housed Penn-Ratcliffe Hardware (1950s), Lay-Simpson Furniture (1970s), and presently Merle Norman Cosmetics and Boutique (since 1980s). At that time, the main entrance was altered and a flared metal roof was added at an angle to emphasize the corner entry.
