Taylor National Bank Building; Citizens Bank and Trust Co. (TAC-20)

In the 1840s-1850s, Ferdinand J. Hiestand ran a tavern on the west end. In 1905, Chandler & Davis Hardware operated in 201. Two major fires between 1910 and 1915 caused extensive alterations on this block. The current building was constructed between 1913 and 1914. Taylor National Bank, known as the Gowdy Bank, occupied the building in 1914 before it closed in 1937. It had been purchased and operated by T.O. Morton when it closed.

Originally, this building was four stories tall until a fire destroyed the top floors. This two-story Bedford stone and New Hampshire granite building was covered with stucco panels in recent years. In 1924, about the middle of the block was Sam and Sodas, a confectionery. Later, 203 was Moberly Grocery, then Hobbs 5 & 10. 205 was Bob Chandler Drug Store, Kroger Grocery, then Taylor County Supply. 207 was Henry Wilkerson Shoe Store, D.L. McCubbins Pool Room, then Brack's Variety.

At 209, John P. Davis brick house was one of the town's finest homes in the 1860s. Green Cottage was followed by Walker & Thompson's Walgreen Drug Store. Letha's Dress Shop and Scotts Apparel occupied 209 in the 20th century. Currently, Citizen's Bank and a federal post office occupy the building.
