Designer Window Fashions (TAC-38)

Built between 1876 and 1900, this two-story Italianate style, two-story brick building housed the office of the Border's Hotel with George Borders, proprietor. Uncle Billie Warren's Tailoring Shop, James Carroll's gun shop also occupied the building. VanHoy & Hill, Jewelers in 1903, followed by R.L. Hill Drug & Jewelry Store, were housed here in the early-1900s. The Campbellsville Circulating Library loaned books from its 600 volume collection in a rear room of the building in the early 1900s. Fire damaged the building in 1911 resulting in new storefront windows. Between 1954 and 1961, Town and Country Restaurant with Turner's Grocery in the back was located here. Then Gaddie's Antiques, Ritzy Raggs, Designer Window Fashions in 1982, and most recently Altman's consignment store were here. The building is currently vacant.
