Chandler Building (TAC-39)

This two-story common bond brick building has leaded glass transoms, a cast iron storefront, stone sills, metal cornice, window hood molds over the second floor windows, emanating the Italianate style. The parapet wall has the name "Chandler" and the date "1893" in the pediment. A brick stringer course separates the decorative blind arcade on the north and west sides while brick panels are found on the west side at the second floor. The building is further enhanced by star shaped tie rods and a paneled entrance highlighted with the egg and dart design.

Historically known as the Chandler Hotel property, the 1895 Fire Insurance Sanborn map shows the building as a general store with clothing on the second floor. By 1910, Hill Brothers Dry Goods were operating in the store and remained there until the 1920s. Other early businesses included the (Walter) Scott and (Ray) Smith Dry Goods which later became Scott's Ladies Apparel. Hobb's Variety Store occupied the building in the 1960s and the 4 Season's Sport Shop during the 1970s and 1980s. Currently the building is being renovated.
