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Chandler's Drug Store (TAC-40)

This two-story, common bond brick building built between 1876 and 1882 has stone sills, tin window hood molds, and a cast iron pilasters from George L. Mesker, Evansville, IN. Brick corbelling and a decorative metal parapet accent this Italianate style building.

W. T. Chandler ran a drugstore on the site from the 1880s until the early-1900s. The March 1911 fire caused \$50 in damage to the building. By the 1930s, Garland Shipp ran a restaurant here, followed by a series of poolrooms including the Megin Davis Pool Hall, a craft shop (the Smock), W. R. Knifley Wholesale Grocery, a shoe store (Gray's), the News-Journal, Creative Press, and an antiques shop (Main Street Memories). Currently The Green Room, a Day Spa, occupies the building.
