Commercial Building; D.W. Gowdy General Store (TAC-41)

This two-story common bond brick building was constructed in 1895. Pedimented metal window hoods, an iron storefront, leaded glass transoms, brick corbelling along the decorative tin parapet wall and pressed tin ceilings on 1st floor; Coakley and Durham written in black and white tile at the recessed front entrance make this an excellent building.

By 1895, a two-story building here housed D.W. Gowdy's General Store on the first floor and clothing and furnishings on the second floor. Gowdy owned the building from the late-1800s until the early 1900s. Buchanan & Sanders opened a hardware store here, operating in 1900, which later became Coakley and Durham Dry Goods (c. 1922-1930). The building housed the Firestone store from the 1940s to the 1970s, then Broadway Appliance store, Café Bonin now Brothers Barbeque Restaurant.
