

Commercial Building; Hill and Cain Realty; City Hall; Fire Department (TAC-50)

This two-story common bond brick building has rusticated brick with segmental arched second story windows. Other details include stone sills, a stringer course, and corbelling on the parapet wall creating a saw-tooth effect. Puryear's General Store occupied this space in 1920; Hill and Cain, then Earl Cain Realty occupied the building until 1967. Previously the building housed city hall and the city water office (ca. 1950). The fire department was housed on the First (North) Street side. The 1908 Sanborn indicates the building housed a Masonic Hall on its upper floor. Other businesses in time have been a barbershop, a bakery, Commonwealth Life Insurance, dentist office and variety store.
