Taylor County Clerk's Office (TAC-8)

Constructed in 1865, this building is located on North Columbia Avenue between Broadway and First Street. Situated on the west end of the Courthouse Square, it is one of the oldest brick buildings remaining in Campbellsville. This late Federal-style building has Flemish bond brick on the front façade with common bond on the sides.

It was constructed to hold county records after Confederate General H.B. Lyon set fire to the courthouse on Christmas day, 1864. One side was the office of the County Clerk and the other side was the office for the Circuit Clerk. Until a new courthouse was constructed, the county court was sometimes held here. In more recent years it has served other purposes such as a school, health department, library, restrooms, and currently the home to the Taylor County Historical Society. The building was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1977.
